


WHY FOREST LANDSCAPE PLANNING?



- Aligns with the Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples Act (DRIPA) and supports reconciliation with Indigenous Peoples
- Consensus-based process developed in partnership and collaboration with First Nations
- Supports transparency and local participation
- Addresses landscape level forest management challenges
- Addresses changing social values and expectations for forests
- Paradigm shift co-management based consensus based ecologically based (resiliency and ecosystem health)




TRANSITION



- Existing planning framework: Forest
 Stewardship Plans (FSP)
- Phased approach
 - FSP will remain in place until Forest Operating Plans are approved.
 - During the transition, FLPs and FSP framework will not overlap geographically.

Legal enactments

Legal objectives of the Land Act

Government Action regulation (GAR) order

Forest Landscape Plans

Established by gov in collaboration with FN

Specifies outcomes and planning guidelines

Forest Operations Plans

Developed by licensees and TSMs and approved by gov

Shows approximate location of blocks and roads for plan term



Land Use Plans

- *Strategic direction for all sectors
- *Social choice decisions (What and where)
- *Balancing land uses & values
- *Broad land use zones & objectives
- *Permanent protected areas
- *Long term plans


Species at Risk Recovery

Forest Landscape Plans

- *Landscape & operational direction for forest management (How)
- *Objectives, practices for defined forest management areas
- * Consistent with LUP direction
- *10-year plans, 5-year reporting

WHAT'S IN A FOREST LANDSCAPE PLAN?

The FLP provides direction for the management of forest resource values and informs the development of the Forest Operations Plan



FLP Geographic Boundary Considerations



No legislated geographic boundary for FLP



Alignment with Indigenous Nations interests



Contiguous area



Capture landscape ecological processes



Alignment with timber supply management units



Consider capacity of all participants



Managing the values placed on forest ecosystem by Indigenous Peoples

FIVE FLP OBJECTIVES



Managing the values placed on ecosystems by local communities



Supporting the protection and conservation of the environment



Supporting production & supply of timber in the forest landscape area



Preventing, mitigating, and adapting to impacts caused by significant disturbances to forests and forest health

EXAMPLE FLP TABLE STRUCTURE




Table structure will depend on the FLP area, issues and participants.

Reflect local community values in forest management

Set landscape and stand level expectations for forest management & clarify the "where" and "how" for harvesting and other forest activities

Established, by order, by the Chief Forester & establish short term (10 year plan) direction to meet a long term vision for future forest conditions

management with
strong emphasis on
monitoring

WHAT ARE THE PHASES OF A FLP?



1) FLP preplanning

- Explore/scope interests
- Identify FLP area
- Develop workplan/ Terms of Reference/ Indigenous consultation and cooperation process

2) Values identification and assessment

- Current condition assessment
- Confirm values

3) Plan Development

- Identify preferred management strategy for selected values
- Finalize draft plan recommendations

4) Plan Establishment

• FLP order

5) Plan Implementation and Monitoring

- Develop and approve Forest Operations Plan(s)
- Implement monitoring plan
- Complete 5-year public report
